No Bones About it
The San Antonio Orthopaedic Group is Proud of it's New South Side Location
*The Group is the First Tenant to Open its Doors in the new Mission Trail Medical Plaza,
and has Begun Seeing Patients*

SAN ANTONIO, June 7 -- The San Antonio Orthopaedic Group announced today that it is the first official tenant to open its doors in the new state of the art Mission Trail Medical Plaza located at Brooks City-Base, and it is now seeing patients. The new medical campus is attracting more specialists to the area and is positioned to become a regional medical center for the South Side of town. The Group's newly relocated outh Side clinic continues to be its seventh clinical site – with each clinic located in a strategic location throughout Bexar County.

Although The San Antonio Orthopaedic Group has had a presence on the South Side for eight years, with 6,500 square feet, this new location is more than three times the space of its original clinic site. The Group's COO, Chris Kean, says the new space will allow “the practice to better serve more patients, and offer quicker appointments for specialized complex care.” From a business perspective, the new site also allows The Group to grow its geographic coverage in an expanding area of town where patients live and work.”

Mission Trail Medical Plaza will also house the Mission Trail Baptist Hospital, which is being constructed as a state-of-the-art, evidence-based designed acute-care facility. The three-story hospital structure is designed for 83 licensed beds and 25 beds of shell space, with the ability to expand both upward and outward to 300 licensed beds. In addition, Mission Trail Baptist Hospital will feature a 15-bed emergency care area and typical ancillary services such as laboratory, pharmacy and imaging. On-site support services for the hospital will include a cafeteria and environmental services.

Kean said, “At our new Mission Trail Medical Plaza clinic, we have state-of-the-art services, including digital xray in office and electronic medical records that allows patients to be seen and treated by our subspecialty physicians -- hand and wrist, foot and ankle, joint replacement, spine and never leave the campus.” She said, “We also can service our patients in physical therapy with our sub-specialty trained physical therapists.”
